

WHAT EACH CHILD RECEIVES

This program serves children recognized by school staff to be in need of basic clothing because their parent or guardian is unable to provide for their needs.

As determined by an administrator, teacher or social worker, children

receive pants, collared shirts, underpants, socks, sweatshirts, and footwear as in-school or family emergencies arise.

NCJW's KIDS COMMUNITY CLOSET relieves teachers of needing to use their own money to buy needed clothing, and personal care items for their students. It makes children whose families do not have resources to provide needed items less self-conscious and less of a potential object of teasing or bullying.

HOW WE SELECT OUR SCHOOLS

Schools selected have an enrollment of more than 90% of students living at or below the federal poverty level. KCCs are now in fourteen Palm Beach County public elementary schools: South Grade and Highland in Lake Worth, Grove Park, Roosevelt, Pleasant City, Forest Hill, Westward and Benoist Farms in West Palm Beach, Lake Park in Lake Park, Cholee Lake, Liberty Park and Heritage in Greenacres and Lantana and Starlight Cove in Lantana. A SPECIAL KCC FOR HOMELESS YOUTH AND THOSE IN FOSTER CARE

10,000 students.

3000 homeless and 800-1000 foster care students are also helped through a unique partnership with the Safe Schools/ Mckinney- Vento Program. KCC provides these children with needed underwear and socks, as well as blankets and personal care items. These critically needed items are not provided by federal funds from the Mckinney-Vento Education Assistance Act.
